**DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:**

Provides decision makers with a comprehensive view of problems and operations with new and projected transportation projects, programs; provides alternative solutions and a picture of the advantages and disadvantages of transportation problems under study; coordinates transportation planning activities with different authorities, such as Navajo Nation Chapters, state, county and various federal agencies; develops and conducts transportation research; writes reports, develops work plans and strategies in land use, economic development, traffic demand, public safety, health and social strategies to solve transportation related problems and identify needs; gathers, analyzes and presents data, research, and plans in written or graphic presentations. Projects long-term influence of legislated and executive transportation related policy changes, that may significantly impact the growth and development of the Nation; deals extensively with policy questions arising from changes; develops transportation plans; obtains and analyzes information related to transportation problem areas and provides reports on conclusions and recommendations; formulates, defines, clarifies and interprets policies, goals and objectives, activities of transportation planning, research and proposals, evaluates the feasibility of transportation projects in relation to federal and tribal laws/policies, costs, trends and social pressures.

**QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS: (Education, Experience and Training)**

**Minimum Qualifications:**

- A Bachelor's degree in Community Planning, Economics, Public Administration, Law, Political Science or Transportation related area or closely related field; and four (4) years of experience in urban and regional planning.

**Special Requirements:**

- Possess a valid state driver's license.

**Special Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:**

Construction project management, evaluate transportation processes and projects, strategic planning. Possession or ability to obtain an appropriate, valid driver's license, Navajo Nation Operators Permit. Knowledge of comprehensive planning, zoning and transportation planning principals. Knowledge of chapter and rural community design, tribal and state transportation laws and applicable federal regulations. Fluency in Navajo but not required. Certified with the American Institute of Certified Planners (AICP) is preferred but not required.
