DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Assist in planning, development of Public Health Education services to meet goals and objectives of Navajo Health Education Program. Assist in the development and implementation of data collection to determine short and long term health needs and priorities for Health Education services at the service unit level. Access individual and community needs for health education; plan health education strategies, interventions, and programs

Provides public health education services for patients, community members, K-12 and college students and worksite employees. Coordinates and collaborates services with various multi-disciplinary health care providers, fire emergency and public safety personnel. Ensure delivery of a comprehensive approach of health information dissemination.

Assessing individual and community needs to plan and implement effective Health Education services. Evaluate the effectiveness of health education and be a resource person for health education. Have expertise in planning for public health presentations, including tact and respect of confidentiality. Plans and presents health information to targeted audiences to raise community awareness of living healthy and maintaining health conditions.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS: (Education, Experience and Training)

Minimum Qualifications:

- A high school diploma or GED; and two (2) years of experience in public or community health.

Preferred Qualifications:

- An associate's degree in Public Health/Community health, health or related.
- Two (2) years experience in public or community health providing health prevention education.
- National Incident Management System Training.

Special Requirements:

- A favorable background investigation
- Possess a valid state driver's license.

Supplemental Information:

Incumbent must obtain a Navajo Nation Vehicle Operator's Permit, a Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Certificate and a First Responder Certificate within 90 days of hire date. Depending upon the needs of the Nation, some incumbents of the class may require to demonstrate fluency in both the Navajo and English languages as a condition of employment.

(To receive full credit for education, certification, or licensure, transcripts, copies of degrees, certificates, and other appropriate documents must be submitted along with employment application.)

Special Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

Knowledge of public health education methodology and principles. Knowledge of tribal, state, and public health & public safety, organizations, their function and services including public health & emergency response. Skills in verbal and written communication and maintaining positive working relationships. Public speaking skills to include ability to interpret medical terminology. Knowledge of social media, principles and practices; knowledge of diverse health-related databases; skill in using computerized sources of health-related information and skilled in identifying factors that foster or hinder the process of health education.
