**DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:**

Under the direction of the Program Supervisor conduct periodic review of a wide variety of complex air quality environmental issues. Interpreting existing Air Regulations, Proposed Regulations/Revision, and additional regulations relating to NNEPA Air Quality Control Program and state/local/tribal Clean Air Act. Analyze and coordinate implementation of Open Burn Regulations. This will include review and draft permits strategies addressing environmental concerns, citizen complaints, initiating corrective actions by determining the most reasonable approach in obtaining compliance with established regulations to a complaint or concern. Participation in work groups and conference calls addressing and discussing other air quality issues and concerns. Along with participation in meeting with Program Supervisor to discuss regulation development plans, including strategy, guidance, updates, setting goals and meeting deliverables of work plan. The position will require an individual to be able to develop database of all incoming open burn applications, along with addressing permits, fees, compliance and enforcement implementation. Attending meetings relating to the Open Burn Regulation issues will need to be completed. Conducting outreach presentation at all type of community functions (i.e. health fair, NN Chapter Meetings, local meeting, conference, etc.) will be needed to address the implementation process of the Open Burn Regulation, along with other air quality related topics. Additional assignment will be given to assist other staff with prioritized projects when needed to help individual broaden understanding and knowledge relating to air quality.

**QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:**

**Education and Training:**

A Bachelor's Degree in Environmental Policy, Environmental Science, Physical Science, Chemistry, Biological, or a closely related field; and

**Experience:**

Four (4) years experience working with environmental programs and/or projects, or an equivalent combination of education, training, and experience which provides the capabilities to perform the described duties.

***(To receive full credit for education, certification, or licensure, transcripts, copies of degrees, certificates, and other appropriate documents must be submitted along with the employment application)***

**Special Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:**

Knowledge of Federal & Tribal Environmental Laws, use of computer applications and ancillary equipment: skill in public outreach, planning, problem solving, and utilizing variety of components of a computer. Depending on the needs of the Nation, some incumbents may be required to demonstrate fluency in both Navajo and English languages.

**License/Certification Requirements:**

Valid state driver's license and a Navajo Nation Vehicle Operator's Permit, ***preferred***.
