DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

This position will provide technical reviews and biological clearances for Navajo Nation Forestry initiatives on timber projects in the woodlands and commercial forest. The Bureau of Indian Affairs/Navajo Region provided 93-638 contract funding to accomplish the goals/objectives. Incumbent would: serve as point of contact, provide advisory support and technical assistance for all timber projects, prepare biological clearances, collection of data/information of wildlife resources and sensitive plants and animals species; work on management and habitat improvement projects to meet short and long term objectives. Improve the monitoring of identified priority plant and animal species, planning of surveys and preparation of technical reports. A major goal is to comply with federal and tribal environmental laws by improved biological reviews and Biological clearance approvals for tribal forestry initiatives. Work requires field analysis of Timber/Wildlife habitat conditions and project coordination which includes driving and walking in an outdoor setting during all weather conditions.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS: (Education, Experience and Training)

Minimum Qualifications:

- A Bachelor's Degree in Wildlife Biology, Wildlife Management or a related field, and two (2) years of experience in wildlife management or wildlife biology field.

Special Requirements:

- A valid state driver license.
- A favorable background investigation.

Special Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

Knowledge of Timber/wildlife management techniques and research methods; General knowledge of ArcView and Geographic Information Systems (GIS) is desirable; Skill in establishing and maintaining effective working relationships with others in the work place; Skill in planning, organizing and directing work of subordinates; Skill in writing technical documents; General knowledge of budget development and administration; Demonstrate ability to work with Federal and State agency scientist and Navajo Tribal land managers is essential.
