**DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:**

Under general supervision, performs work of moderate difficulty in planning and overseeing the day to day installation, operation, maintenance and repair of surveillance equipment; assists in the design, planning, and implementation of surveillance systems and ensures compliance with tribal and state gaming compact requirements. Develops and maintains preventive maintenance schedules on all equipment to limit disruption in surveillance operations; oversees and/or assists in the installation, operation, maintenance and repair of closed circuit television (CCTV) equipment, fixed PTZ cameras, and access control equipment. Maintains smooth installation of new surveillance equipment around the casino premises and tribal area for surveillance purposes; works with outside contractors involved in the installation of new equipment to limit disruptions; logs and maintains accurate records of installation, maintenance, repair and preventive maintenance conducted on all equipment; inventories, orders, and ensures spare parts are available when needed; keeps abreast of changing trends as it pertains to state of the art surveillance equipment and emerging technologies; travel in tribal vehicle to various project sites. Performs related work as assigned.

**QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS: (Education, Experience and Training)**

**Minimum Qualifications:**

- A high school diploma/GED; and three (3) years of work experience in electronics or casino surveillance; or an equivalent combination of education and experience.

**Special Requirements:**

- Must possess or be able to obtain a gaming license/certification from the State of Arizona and/State of New Mexico and the Navajo Nation Gaming Regulatory Office.
- Possess a valid state driver's license.

**Special Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:**
