DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Establish the Navajo Puppy Adoption Program for the fostering, vetting and adoption of puppies off the Navajo Nation. This position is responsible for the training and building of a foster volunteer base, networking with humane animal organizations, working with the three agency veterinary clinics and the possible transport of puppies to transfer destinations for removal from the Navajo Nation. Collaboration with surrounding shelters, animal control programs and humane organizations for support, donations and animal rescue. A complete marketing platform is to be established with all media, both radio & print, a newsletter, brochures and handouts to stress animal health and the humane treatment of animals. Outreach education in schools, headstart, chapters, tribal programs and private businesses. When time is available to conduct animal petting programs for rest homes and elderly care facilities. Program goals include the reduction of roaming dogs, vaccination & deworming, the use of tick products, proper care and sheltering of pets, proper tie out with run lines, stop abandonment platform and promoting of the mobile veterinary unit services. This person maybe required to assist with veterinary mobile unit services at the scheduled chapter or NHA sites. This position will provide support to the ASO of the NNVM at minimum of five (5) hours per week.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS: (Education, Experience and Training)

Minimum Qualifications:

- A Bachelor's degree in Public or Business Administration or in a closely related field; or an equivalent combination of education and experience.

Special Requirements:

- Possess a valid state driver's license.

(To receive full credit for education, certification, or licensure, transcripts, copies of degrees, certificates, and other appropriate documents must be submitted along with employment application.)

Special Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

Understanding of animal vaccinations / deworming, general health, restraint techniques, bite prevention, general clinic sanitation, and clinic flow.
