DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Provide technical assistance to Transit Manager and Program Supervisor in assessing current route operations; performing Bus Stop location assessments; assist with grant writing and development of grant applications; manage Grant milestones and ensuring that milestones are met; Facilitates Coordination Committee which coordinates local transportation providers to assess needs, strategizes to address gaps, and improve efficiencies for transportation service delivery within the Navajo Nation; Facilitates Transit Advisory Committee (TAC) and coordinates quarterly meetings; Knowledge of Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and specific applications to public transportation; Develop performance targets/goals and measurements; Develop Transit short range plan and long range plan; Work with various Department of Transportations for future road construction projects in coordinating bus stop locations and bus pull-outs.

Conduct transit related research and planning studies in transit projects pertaining to ridership analysis and projections, analysis of operating practices, routes, bus stops, schedules; make recommendations for alternative and non-traditional transit services. Conduct ridership surveys and public surveys. Cultivate partnerships and multi-agency activities; manage a coordinated community-wide transportation service network; coordinate routes with other transit agencies, transportation providers to promote a full range of travel options. Serve as a liaison for the department to outside entities; work with Navajo Nation Chapters, departments and businesses to provide information on our public transportation services. Attend public hearings. Knowledge of Customer Service principles and applying those to provide the best customer service experience.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS: (Education, Experience and Training)

Minimum Qualifications:

- A Bachelor's degree in Transportation, Community Planning, Architecture, Engineering, Sociology, Geography, Economics, Political Science; and two (2) years of experience in transit planning, urban planning, social science, engineering, regional planning or closely related area; or an equivalent combination of education and experience.

Special Requirements:

- Possess a valid state driver's license.
- A favorable background investigation is required.
