In accordance to established care plan, provide health screening by taking vitals (e.g. blood pressure, respiration, weight, height, random glucose reading, temperature, etc.); checks and/or clean wounds, dresses wounds, monitors and/or administers medication as prescribed under supervision of a health care provider; reviews with client and/or family member the direction of taking prescribed and/or over the counter medications, educates prenatal/postpartum clients with breastfeeding, formula feeding and child development; checks for client's scheduled appointments; arranges for transport if necessary; assists with range of motion exercises; provides translation for patient/client as needed; maintains records of observation, progress, activities and other pertinent information utilizing the patient care component (PCC) and Subjective, Objective, Assessment, and Plan (SOAP) format; reports any significant problems or changes in client's condition and needs to the appropriate nurse/health provider; maintains daily log of activities; enters and maintains client information into Electronic Health Record; maintains strict client confidentiality; assists in the development of care plan; performs chart reviews; assist health care provider with delinquent immunization referrals from public/community health nurse; maintains records of all case findings; provide direct patient/client care; assist with personal hygiene (e.g. bathing, shampooing, foot care, nail care); provide homemaker services including but not limited to cleaning , wash dishes, meal preparation and laundry if necessary. Provides health education on various health topics, including but not limited to communicable diseases, prevention, nutrition, etc.; coordinates services and assists community in the use of other available resources; assists in emergency situations as needed; attend meetings and health related trainings; involves moderate effort in traveling long distance throughout the Navajo Nation to provide health services; and other assigned duties b

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS: (Education, Experience and Training) Minimum Qualifications:

• A high school diploma or GED; and four (4) years of work experience as a Certified Nursing Assistant; or two (2) years of experience as a Community Health Worker with the Navajo Nation CHR/Outreach Program.

Special Requirements:

- A favorable background investigation. (If selected for the position, tribal, federal, and state background checks must be completed prior to employment at the applicant's expense.)
- Possess a current Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) Certificate and a valid state driver's license.
