DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Under general direction, performs technical mining engineering work of considerable difficulty and complexity with responsibility to oversee the Navajo Nation's (NN) solid minerals program; provides expertise in surface mining and geo-technical engineering; oversees the revenue generating aspects of the program; performs related work as assigned. Provides leadership and guidance to program staff; develops budgets; monitors expenditures. Provides mining engineering expertise and policy advice to the Minerals Department on complex and controversial mining and reclamation issues where long and short range planning may need to be re-evaluated to accommodate changing situations; develops and implements policies and procedures of major importance which have significant bearing on reclamation of coal mined lands, coal exploration and environmental impacts; participates in and provides assistance with revenue generation, mine development, management, administrative, financial and legislative decisions. Represents the Minerals Department in dealing with senior mine management officials, local, state and federal government agencies, and citizens in developing agreement and resolving conflicts. Develops mining policies and procedures; determines if technical reviews and inspections are conducted in a timely manner and in compliance with mining laws and regulations, assists in the finalization and implementation of the Navajo Nation Reclamation Code and Regulations. Manages the Navajo Nation hard minerals resources. Maintains the production and royalty record and analyzes the potentials for hard minerals resources exploration and development. Assists in economic analysis of energy resources exploration; development and transpiration projects. Oversees the Mine Safety Program according to the Navajo Nation Mine Safety Code (Title 18 N.N.C. § 401-411).

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS: (Education, Experience and Training)

Minimum Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree in Mining Engineering or a related field; and five (5) years mining engineering experience, two (2) years of which must have been in a supervisory capacity.

Special Requirements:

- Possess a valid state driver's license.

Special Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:
