DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Oversees and directly supervises the Vanderwagen Water Resources field office and its personnel in the construction, installation, repair, and maintenance of community and livestock water facilities; provides direction, guidance and instruction; schedules and assigns duties; supervises and assists with the operation and use of pneumatic tools, welding, and other equipment; maintains records, materials, supplies, equipment, and facilities; instructs subordinates with work quality and projections; prepares project status reports; keep and update cost reports, daily work reports, and submit to central office on scheduled basis; ensures that assigned tribal vehicle and equipment's are in good working condition; maintains compliance of community water systems with USEPA standards; interpret and understand technical and engineering drawings of water systems and their infrastructures; attend meetings i.e.. chapter, state, federal, other entities, and other departments to represent program. Must adhere to Drug and Alcohol Free Workplace policy of Navajo Nation.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Education, Experience and Training:

High school graduate or GED certificate and

Two (2) years supervisory experience in construction and maintenance; or an equivalent combination of education/training and experience which provides the capabilities to perform the described duties.

(To receive full credit for education, certification, or licensure, transcripts, copies of degrees, certificates, and other appropriate documents must be submitted along with employment application.)

Special Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

Knowledge of: Applicable federal, state and local standards and regulations related to construction; practices, procedures, and methods of construction, maintenance and repair; tools, equipment and materials used in construction, maintenance and repair activities; project management and scheduling techniques; occupational hazards and safety procedures; principles and practices of employee supervision, training and evaluation.

Skilled in: Preparing scope of work, construction plans and specifications; scheduling and directing construction and maintenance tasks; implementing and monitoring budgets; inspecting and evaluating construction, maintenance and repair activities; supervising, training, evaluating employees and scheduling work assignments and activities; establishing and maintaining effective work relationships and communicating effectively.

Physical Requirements: Must be capable of lifting/carrying materials, equipment, supplies in excess of 100 pounds; climbing to heights of 40 feet or more; working in confined spaces; working in all types of weather conditions.

Special Requirements:

- 1.) **(Preferred)** Applicant must possess a Valid State Driver's License (Required)
- 2.) Ability to obtain a Navajo Nation Vehicle Operator's Permit within 90 days of employment (Required)
- 3.) **(Preferred)** Must possess a valid AZ or NM Water Operator Certification. (Required)
