DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Determines eligibility within sixty (60) days of application for individuals with disabilities applying for vocational rehabilitation services. Documents necessary medical, social, assessments and interview information relevant to the disabling condition to assist in vocational planning. Provides the full array of vocational rehabilitation services to eligible consumers with disabilities including but not limited to counseling and guidance, job development, job placement. Develops appropriate individualized plans for employment (IPE) with specific employment outcome that is chosen by the eligible individual consistent with the unique strengths, resources, priorities, concerns abilities, and conducts job developmental for consumers with disabilities prepare for securing, retaining, or regaining an employment outcome. Monitors consumer's progress in reaching a viable and successful employment outcome. Works directly with service providers, programs, employers, school personnel, community organizations and families in the areas of services and new program development for Navajo people with disabilities. Submits quarterly reports, statistical information and represents the program at meeting relevant to providing services to Navajo people with disabilities. Advocates on behalf of Navajo people with disabilities in the development of additional resources and services.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS: (Education, Experience and Training)

Minimum Qualifications:

- A Bachelor's degree in Counseling, Social Work, Psychology or related field; and one (1) year professional vocational counseling work experience; or an equivalent combination of education and experience.

Special Requirements:

- A favorable background investigation.
- Possess a valid state driver's license.

(To receive full credit for education, certification, or licensure, transcripts, copies of degrees, certificates, and other appropriate documents must be submitted along with employment application.)

Special Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

Ability to communicate effectively in English and in the Navajo language. Knowledge of resources for Navajo people with disabilities in the areas of employment, training, and other supportive related services. Ability to work effectively with people with disabilities in the areas of personal and social adjustment. Ability to conduct interviews and case documentations. Must have good writing skills.
