DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

This is a challenging and rewarding career opportunity for an experienced airport leader with a proven track record of deploying innovative aviation solutions and achieving results. This position is responsible for the daily operation, maintenance, and administration of the five (5) National Plan of Integrated Airport Systems (NPIAS) airports with the Navajo Nation. The Navajo Nation has three (3) NPIAS airports in Arizona and two (2) NPIAS airports in New Mexico and are in two (2) Federal Aviation Administration regions respectively by state. The manager oversees the department budget, contract modifications, scope of change orders, record of negotiations, funding agreements, independent fee estimates for airport capital improvement projects. The duties also include applying for state and FAA airport improvement grants and state DOT entitlements. In coordination with respective agencies the manager participates programming an annual five-year airport capital improvement plan; participates in the development of maintenance and construction contracts following the Navajo Nation, State, and FAA procurement laws. The manager plays an important role in working with the Federal Aviation Administration, Arizona Department of Transportation Aeronautics Group, and the New Mexico Department of Transportation Aviation's Division to build upon a reputation for providing high-performance outcomes and excellent service to the aviation community. Oversees airport operations; quality, security, and safety compliance; emergency response and planning; enforces airport rules and regulations; manages community and aviation service inquiries, including notice to airmen; response to concerns, complaints, and public outreach. Handles community relations by promoting aviation and airport facilities. The manager provides leadership and development of department staff; reporting, establishes strategic department goals and objectives; participated in the recruitment process, evaluates work performance, ensures policy and procedures compliance, and oversee employee relations, assures appropriate balance exists between the budget, goals, and objectives, funding limitations and service levels.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS: (Education, Experience and Training)

Minimum Qualifications:

- Bachelor of Science degree in Aeronautics, Aviation, Business, Public Administration or Business Administration, Engineering or related field and six (6) years experience in program related experience, Airport Management or Planning, Road and Airport Maintenance; two (2) years of which must have been a supervisory capacity; or an equivalent combination of education and experience.

Special Requirements:
