DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Manage the Animal Control Program and provide supervision and support to Senior Animal Control Officers, Animal Control Officers and Kennel Officers. Provide guidance and direction to Program activities and direct services while ensuring compliance with established Standard Operating Procedures. Establish and implement animal control policies and procedures, as needed. Ensure effective service delivery of animal control services to Navajo Nation communities, including an education and outreach program on responsible pet ownership and Navajo Nation animal control laws and regulations, and provide an effective enforcement program of Navajo Nation animal control laws and regulations utilizing available manpower and resources. Prepare annual fiscal year budgets and present to relevant Executive Branch and Legislative Branch entities. Seek external funding and external partnerships for the Program and its activities. Coordinate rabies/distemper vaccination clinics and coordinate community enforcement projects. Provide oversight of Agency animal shelters to ensure Program standards and applicable health standards are met. Monitor adjudicated animal control citations.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS: (Education, Experience and Training)

Minimum Qualifications:

- A Bachelor's degree in Public or Business Administration or a closely related program discipline; and five (5) years program related experience; two (2) years of which must have been in a supervisory capacity; or an equivalent combination of education and experience.

Special Requirements:

- Must possess a valid State Driver's License.
- A favorable background investigation.

Special Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:
