DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Work with Grant, Contract, BIE and Public Schools. Monitor and assist these schools for the Navajo language and culture programs. Provide training for Navajo language and culture teachers on curriculum development, teaching strategies and methods; one-on-one technical assistance culture teachers for effective language, culture and immersion programs as needed; prepare detailed report of Grant & Contract schools for reauthorization each year; assist and address teaching strategies, methods, educational theories and movements, content information of the Diné Content Standards, Navajo culture, customs and practices, information regarding language immersion, and others as may be requested by schools or as assigned by OSCAD, DODE or the Navajo Nation. Assists in the revisions of assessment instruments i.e., the Diné Content Standards, Oral Diné Language, Bilingual Seal, and the language & culture certification. Be cognizant of educational policies, legislation of all entities. Assist in proposal development for Navajo language and culture projects, assessment and training, resource development, working with parents and communities to implement language and culture learning environment; assist with Memorandum of Agreement between the public school districts and the Navajo Nation; assist with resource materials to supplement and compliment the (5) Diné Content Standards.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS: (Education, Experience and Training)

Minimum Qualifications:

- A Bachelor's degree in Elementary, Secondary Education or related field; and four (4) years in the educational field including classroom teaching and supervisory responsibility.

Special Requirements:

Must read, write and speak Navajo. Travel to schools in Arizona, New Mexico, and Utah. Presentations for schools, conferences, and radio talk show; Knowledgeable about Navajo philosophy and traditional ways of knowing.

Knowledge of advanced educational concepts, principles, theories and administration.
