DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Under the general supervision of the Program Manager III perform professional health education services of moderate difficulty using health education methods and principles – assessment, planning, coordinating, developing, implementing and evaluating specialized programs or a series of health programs. Senior Health Educator will assist with formulating Program goals, objectives, service delivery methods and evaluation strategies and participate in the development of specific phases of more complex projects. Maintains strict confidentiality of employee and client information and records. Use Microsoft Office software to develop PowerPoint presentations, use Excel to produce reports and data, etc.

Conduct community health needs assessments. Plans develop, organize, implement and deliver direct public health education programs and trainings on specialized health topics, including but not limited to: promoting healthy living, preventing or maintenance of chronic and communicable diseases, providing school health education services, injury prevention, responding to declared emergencies and promoting environmental health. Coordinates peer education at schools, communities, worksites. Design and deliver presentations on a variety of health topics including substance abuse, sexual health, physical activity, chronic and communicable diseases, and emergency preparedness. Manage community/public health awareness and wellness events for monthly health observances.

Conducts health screenings and makes referrals to appropriate health providers, serves as a liaison between individual, health care providers, and community organizations to coordinate resources and services to promote health education services. Assist in the design, preparation, field testing and evaluation of a variety of health education materials; recommend the use and distribution of educational materials for training sessions, workshops, conferences and professional presentations.

- Membership to National Health Organizations, e.g. American Public Health Association (APHA). Society for Public Health Education (SOPHE).

Special Requirements:

- Possess a valid state driver's license.

Special Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

Knowledge of public health education methodology and principles. Knowledge of tribal, state and public health organizations their function and services. Bi-lingual speaking preferred (Navajo and English). Skills at multi-tasking since position will respond to multiple issues, sites and structures.
