Conducts safety and injury prevention presentations; provides traffic safety and alcohol prevention education; plans organizes and conducts promotional activities; coordinates and assists the car seat loaner program; schedules and conducts defensive driving classes; conducts seatbelt usages surveys; disseminates traffic statistical data and Navajo Nation traffic law information; designs, creates, and develops brochures, graphic aids, informational material and manuals to assist in presentations or instructions to the Navajo Nation employees and the Navajo Nation communities. Works closely with the media in preparing public service announcement on prevention and safe driving, prepares documents for newspaper on safety and injury prevention. Is required to attend scheduled meetings, trainings, and other required reports. i.e.. Monthly Quarterly reports.
