#### DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Conducts field investigations and initiates appropriate enforcement concerning violation or Navajo Nation, state and/or federal law, rules, regulations, policies and procedures regarding livestock, forestry, environmental, land, water, hunting, fishing, boating and antiquities; determines validity of alleged offense; collects and secures evidence; takes testimony, identifies, witnesses, takes statements and other items necessary for subsequent investigation and potential court activity, patrol areas or scenic, natural recreation, archaeological and or scientific impertinence. Issues citation for violations of Navajo Nation Code 14,17 and Park regulations and policies.

Provides assistance and services to visitors; provide educational information or natural and environmental resources protection, crime presentation and community awareness; perform and/or oversees the application or various natural resource, regulatory services involving such environmental, cultural laws, and regulations mineral exploration and development and right-of-way; assist other law enforcement agencies and Navajo Nation departments as requested; assists in search and rescue; maintains daily log of activities; prepares required reports; attend meetings and trainings.

#### QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS (EDUCATION, EXPERIENCE and TRAINING)

##### MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- A high school diploma/GED; and one (1) year of experience as a ranger, military or civilian law enforcement officer, or closely related work.

##### SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

- A favorable background investigation.
- Possess a valid state driver's license.
- Must have completed an approved Basic Law Enforcement Training Program.
- Undergo an annual physical examination.

**SPECIAL, KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS and ABILITIES:**

Knowledge in Navajo Nation, state and federal laws, policies and procedures governing natural resources and protection. Must basic knowledge in law enforcement, protection of cultural and natural resource laws and Navajo Nation Title to be able to enforce protection of the

natural resources and culture. Skills in performing law enforcement related and related strenuous and dangerous work involving arrest, apprehension and detaining of suspects, performing various emergency and non-emergency duties, be able to work with staff and other

entities, go communication skills and be able to understanding instructions, oral and written.
